the audited statements published in this month's Journal. As members probably know, I am stepping down as Treasurer at this time. I thank the committee for its support and

wish the new committee every success.

Technical Officer: Neville Kunnel—Good evening everyone, the Log Book scheme has not come into operation yet, perhaps in 2011.

As usual we have had a couple of issues with Vic Roads, where the members were given the runabouts due to inexperience on the part of the Vic Roads Officers but we managed to sort things out without much of a problem.

There were 12 new Registrations during the year (11 cars and 1 motor cycle). One of these is a very rare and perhaps the only one in the country a 1948 Tucker and another not so rare is a 1976 Opel Manta. The others were 1973 Ford Escort, 1966 Mercedes 250S, 1953 Holden 215, 1955 Holden FJ, 1968 Ford XT, 1980 Toyota Corolla, 1959 Jaguar MK II, 1949 Vauxhall Wyvern and a 1970 BMW R 75/5, Motor Cycle. I am hoping that these vehicles will join us on Presentation Day on the 28th November.

My thanks to Max and Vin for taking over my duties during May and June when I was away and Ian for showing me the ropes when I took over his duties early this year.

Hope we will be able to make 2011 a more interesting year, I am sure together we can. Thank you all.

Membership Secretary: Max Austin—The past year was steady enough with no real matters that challenged the Club other than the ongoing and so far unfruitful quest for Committee members needed to strengthen our operation and spread the work-load to ensure smooth running. It appears that members generally have little interest in the internal workings of the Club and are happy to cruise along with whatever is put up to them but they must realise that someone has to stoke the boiler.

Happily I can report that in taking stock of our membership over the past 15 years, we are continuing in excellent shape. This report falls due as the start of the annual membership renewal period kicks in and at present I am happy to advise that renewals are running close to the same numbers recorded at this time during the last couple of years indicating that we have the support of our members. Those that we lose due to many varied and unavoidable reasons are replaced by new additions to the membership Register. The final result of renewals for last year was that our 2009-10 Register finally recorded some 218 memberships with 85 joint memberships for a total of 303 members with some 600 vehicles listed. After renewals were completed in March '10 we recorded a loss of 20 memberships which was softened by the gain of 19 new memberships. Our current 2010-11 Directory lists 218 memberships with 88 joint members for a total of 306 members with some 590 plus vehicles. At the moment all indications are we're in great shape and can look forward to another worthwhile year. Letter to the (ex) Secretary

Dear Mr. Galley,

REVISED CLUB PERMIT SCHEME

You will recall that in November 2009, Vic Roads released a discussion paper titled "Proposal for Revision of the Victorian Club Permit Scheme" for community and stakeholder comment. The paper elicited a broad range of comments which Vic Roads has taken on board. An overwhelming majority of submissions were in favour of the proposed changes.

As a result I have approved a number of changes including the introduction of Log Books to record the use of Club vehicles. Other changes are:

- Vehicles will be allowed to be driven within a radius of 100 metres from the vehicles home address without the need for a log book entry to be completed.
- The current 25 year eligibility for entry to the club permit scheme will be retained.
- The regulations will allow Vic Roads to provide information to assist clubs in administering the permit scheme and to apply sanctions against individuals or clubs for misuse of vehicles, number plates or log books.

These changes will provide significant benefits to permit holders by increasing the flexibility of use of club vehicles, remove the uncertainty of the legality of using club vehicles on the road and enforcement improvement.

I have asked Vic Roads to proceed with the drafting of regulations which will allow the revised scheme to be implemented as soon as possible.

It is expected that the changes will be implemented from February 2011.

You will be kept informed of progress relating to the implementation of these important changes to the scheme. Yours Sincerely Tim Pallas. MP.
