20-27 NOVEMBER 2021

In 2021 RACV will celebrate the centenary of the RACV Alpine Trials, events that were significant milestones in Australian automotive history. To commemorate those milestones, RACV, along with the Vintage Drivers Club, will be organising an event recreating the original 1921 Alpine Trial. The RACV Alpine Trial Centenary will be held from Saturday 20 November to Saturday 27 November 2021.

HISTORY

RACV held a series of reliability trials between 1921-1926. The route of the inaugural 1921 trial ran from Melbourne to Lakes Entrance, Tallangatta, Mount Buffalo, Wangaratta and Healesville before returning to Melbourne via a final loop through Ballarat and Geelong.

The trial focused on Victoria's Alpine region, advocating for both tourism and the construction of better roads and services to expand the touring potential of north-east Victoria. They were were both reliability and efficiency contests. Hill climbing contests and fuel consumption tests were also included with automobile companies using the associated publicity to promote their vehicles.

The RACV Alpine Trial Centenary event will follow, as close as practicable, the route of the 1921 RACV 1000 Mile Reliability Trial.

THE CENTENARY FUENT

A maximum of 100 vehicles will be permitted to enter, with preference given to vehicles that competed in the original events and to other vehicles manufactured during the period of the trials: 1921-1926.

Entries will be accepted in 3 Tiers. Preference for acceptance will be in the order of these tiers.

TIER 1: Vehicles that actually contested any of the four RACV events between 1921-1926.

TIER 2: Vehicles of the same make and model as the original contestants of the 1921-1926 trials.

TIER 3a: Other vehicles manufactured between 1921-1926.

TIER 3b: Vintage vehicles up to 1930.



The decision to go ahead with the Tour will be subject to obtaining a sponsor and COVID-19 restrictions, and if there is a risk to congregate 120 people, offer accommodation or travel into NSW we reserve the right to alter, amend or cancel the Tour. We will confirm on 2 April 2021 or advise everyone of a new date.

ENTRY FEE is planned as \$240per vehicle (depending on sponsorship) and will be payable with the Entry Form (when the tour is confirmed) Entry will include 2 adults for lunch at Marong, the final dinner and breakfast in Bendigo, some entertainment, tour numberplate and assorted memorabilia. CHACA CLUB PERMIT SCHEME ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

CHACA is a VicRoads authorised Club to participate in the VicRoads Club Permit Scheme (CPS).

VicRoads has set rules to determine the eligibility of vehicles for the Club Permit Scheme. These may be viewed in the CPS handbook or on the VicRoads website. CHACA has set its own additional requirements for vehicles to be submitted for the CPS using CHACA's authorisation. The additional requirements are in line with the original CHACA charter of vehicle originality and preservation.

The following are CHACA's requirements for Members submitting vehicles for CPS assessment.

- 1. The vehicle must have been manufactured prior to 1st December 1992.
- 2. The member submitting the application must have been a CHACA member for at least 3 months.
- 3. Vehicles submitted for CPS application must be as the manufacturer originally designed and built. Some modifications are permitted in line with the original manufacture option list, are period correct, or are based on safety issues, but in all cases must not detract from originality. Replicas derived from a lower model are acceptable as long as the appearance is as original as possible to the intended vehicle model (e.g. GT Falcon from a base Falcon).
- 4. Applicants for the CPS will certify that the vehicle submitted will remain roadworthy during the permit period and unmodified from what was originally submitted.
- 5. Once a vehicle has been accepted by CHACA for CPS it will be the members' responsibility to maintain the vehicle as originally presented, with no further modifications and in a roadworthy condition for all permit renewal applications.
- 6. Determination of the eligibility for any vehicle submitted to CHACA for CPS will be at the discretion of the Committee. Vehicle CPS application must be submitted to the Technical Officer in writing.






