

Classic car auction puts flooded town back on the map

Sitting in a warehouse car park among a row of baby blue vintage Holdens, "God's own car" was up for auction.

The auctioneer's homily about the HR Holden special sedan wasn't far from the truth for devoted classic car fans at a sale of rare models and parts in Molong, central west NSW, on Sunday. About 100 potential buyers, some who travelled from as far as the Kimberley in Western Australia, endured blazing heat to watch local truck driver Craig Barham's beloved collection go under the hammer.

Prized pieces included a forest green 1947 Chevrolet Stylemaster Ute, which sold for \$43,750, and a gleaming olive 1967 Chevrolet Impala, snapped up for \$46,000.

A Melbourne bidder bought a pastel Holden EJ station wagon featured in the 2000 Australian movie The Dish for \$29,000, while retro Harley Davidson motorbikes sold for between \$3400 and \$28,000.

As bidding stalled on a particularly rare early Holden, auctioneer Ashley Burns turned up the heat. "Search the country and I bet you won't find another one of these," Mr Burns told the crowd. "Imagine the big smile on your face when you rock up to work tomorrow."

The highest bidder bought the HD X2 special station wagon - in need of loving restoration - for \$5100.

The sale was the first in-person event for the auction house since COVID-19 restrictions, as buyers in Molong competed with online bidders across the country.

"The best way is to have people here because they get caught up in the emotion of it," Mr Burns told AAP.

Buyers and spectators, mostly men in car brand T-shirts, singlets and worn-out caps and Akubras, took cover in small patches of shade as the temperature crept up towards 35C.

Larry Follington, a collector from the NSW Hawkesbury region, said the sale was significant as parts were becoming harder to find.

"I've been working on some of these cars since I was 13 and I have a few of them - about 50," Mr Follington said with a chuckle.

The action was one of the first major events in Molong since an enormous flash flood in November which didn't affect the warehouse sitting on high ground.

The event was catered by locals whose businesses were lost or damaged.

Tania Lampe, who has not been able to re-open her cafe and homewares shop on the main street due to severe flood damage, served up tall iced coffees to cool the crowd.

She said many locals were doing it tough, as people started to bypass Molong while businesses were boarded up and repaired.

"I'm still trying to get my head around where to go because that shop was my dream," Ms Lampe said. "Something like this is so great for the town. We need people to come back."

Police investigate theft of 'extremely rare' 1960s race car driven by Jack Brabham

An extremely rare 1960s race car has been found damaged and unable to be driven, after it was stolen from a property in the wealthy Melbourne suburb of Toorak.

Police are investigating the theft of the Brabham BT21, which is believed to have occurred on Hill Street in the early hours of Thursday morning.

The race car is very rare, with only five others like it in the world.

The vintage vehicle was discovered on Grange Road by officers on patrol and police said It had been abandoned just streets away from where it had been taken.

"I don't think they knew how to turn on all the switches to be able to start it properly," owner Peter Williams told ABC Radio Melbourne Friday morning.

Mr Williams was set to be competing in the car at the Phillip Island Classic this weekend — a five-day event which draws hundreds of historic race cars from across Australia and abroad.

Mr Williams said the rare car was driven by Australian racing legend Sir Jack Brabham.

The damage done to the clutch has put the vehicle out of the game for now, but Mr Williams said he had high hopes he would be able to get it back on the road.

He said he feels "very lucky" it was found.

Investigators are asking anyone with information about the theft to come forward by contacting Crime Stoppers.

CHACA CLUB PERMIT SCHEME **ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES**

CHACA is a VicRoads authorised Club to participate in the VicRoads Club Permit Scheme (CPS).

VicRoads has set rules to determine the eligibility of vehicles for the Club Permit Scheme. These may be viewed in the CPS handbook or on the VicRoads website. CHACA has set its own additional requirements for vehicles to be submitted for the CPS using CHACA's authorisation. The additional requirements are in line with the original CHACA charter of vehicle originality and preservation.

The following are CHACA's requirements for Members submitting vehicles for CPS assessment.

- 1. The vehicle must have been manufactured prior to 31st December 1992.
- 2. Vehicles submitted for CPS application must be as the manufacturer originally designed and built. Some modifications are permitted in line with the original manufacture option list, are period correct, or are based on safety issues, but in all cases must not detract from originality. Replicas derived from a lower model are acceptable as long as the appearance is as original as possible to the intended vehicle model (e.g. GT Falcon from a base Falcon).
- Applicants for the CPS will certify that the vehicle submitted will remain roadworthy during the 3. permit period and unmodified from what was originally submitted.
- 4. Once a vehicle has been accepted by CHACA for CPS it will be the members' responsibility to maintain the vehicle as originally presented, with no further modifications and in a roadworthy condition for all permit renewal applications.
- 5. Determination of the eligibility for any vehicle submitted to CHACA for CPS will be at the discretion of the Committee. Vehicle CPS application must be submitted to the Technical Officer in




