PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I noted in the minutes of the October Federation Meeting that the Veteran Car Club has discussed and accepted the FIVA Classification of Historic Vehicles. For those that are not familiar with FIVA (Fédération Internationale des Véhicules Anciens) or in our language the International Federation of Historic Vehicles, this international body based in Europe would be the equivalent of the Australian Historic Motoring Federation (AHMF).

They have affiliations around the world and is a world-wide organisation looking after the interests of owners of Historic Vehicles.

Other club representatives at that meeting indicated that they were in opposition to accepting international regulations developed by FIVA in Australia. CHACA at this point has not received a copy of the regulations promulgated by FIVA and therefore does not have an opinion on whether CHACA would participate in such an arrangement. What concerns me however is the type of ruling that was recently established by FIVA on electric conversions of Historic Vehicles, and elsewhere in this issue there is a news item issued by FIVA on that very subject. (Read more on Page 6 & 7)

The effect of such a ruling would prevent owners taking steps to keep their historic vehicle on the road when emissions standards get out of control and fuel gets scarce. Effectively if an owner changed the drive system of the car it would no longer be classified as an Historic Vehicle and not only lose value but would be subject to all the current design rules and regulations. Something for future discussions.

A few members attended the Australia Day event at Ballarat. This event was run by the Vintage & Classic Car Club of Ballarat at the Grey Hound Racing Venue. Fortunately the weather was kind with an overcast sky and moderate temperatures. Cars were parked on the main oval of the facility and there was plenty of room for all but no shade. Some excellent cars were present and as I did not make a count I can only guess at a few hundred.

The racing clubs facilities were excellent with food and bar facilities and very nice outdoor & indoor dining areas. The club had on display fashions going right back to the late eighteen hundreds and also ran a fashion show which was enjoyable particularly for the ladies. All in all it was a good day. Electrification of Historic Vehicles: Statement from FIVA

(Refer to President's Report earlier)

An increasing number of commercial outfits are offering to convert historic vehicles to run on electric power, replacing the entire drivetrain with an electric unit and batteries.

In this way, they claim, it's possible to retain the classic appearance of the vehicle while meeting modern environmental standards. As an additional benefit, the conversion might also increase power and performance. Some conversion companies have even obtained permission from the type approval/certification authorities to retain the original Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) of the donor vehicle, despite more or less replacing the entire drivetrain.

FIVA's view on electrification

FIVA (the *Fédération Internationale des Véhicules Anciens* or international federation of historic vehicles) understands the motivation of some owners to electrify their vehicles – and acknowledges that, subject to legislation and regulation, all modifications are a matter of personal choice.

However, FIVA – as an organisation dedicated to the preservation, protection and promotion of historic vehicles – cannot promote, to owners or regulators, the use of modern EV components (motors and batteries) to replace an historic vehicle's powertrain.

Conversion of historic vehicles from their original internal combustion engines to electric power doesn't comply with the FIVA definition of an historic vehicle, nor does it support the goal of preserving historic vehicles and their related culture. In FIVA's view, vehicles so converted cease to be historic vehicles, unless they are subject only to 'in period' changes.

According to FIVA, an historic vehicle is 'a mechanically propelled road vehicle' that is:

- at least 30 years old
- preserved and maintained in an historically correct condition
- not used as a means of daily transport
- part of our technical and cultural heritage

Concludes Tiddo Bresters, FIVA's Vice President, Legislation, "It is not, in our opinion, the shape or body style of a vehicle that makes it 'historic', but the way in which the entire vehicle has been constructed and manufactured in its original form.

"Hence if any owner, motor engineer or manufacturer chooses to make such conversions to an historic vehicle, FIVA would strongly recommend that any changes are reversible, with all the original components marked and safely stored. In this way, the vehicle may – if so desired in the future – be returned to its original state and may once again become an historic vehicle."

NOTHING COMES CLOSE TO OWNING A VINTAGE CAR

A shiny, brand new car immediately loses value as soon as it leaves the showroom.

However, vintage cars are in a different league in terms of their rarity and monetary worth and can prove a highly valuable investment for shrewd collectors.

Vintage car collector Giovanni Patané first became interested in 1970s cars after being driven in his uncle's red Alfa Romeo Berlina as a child.

"Those experiences stay with you, particularly when you're driven from the country to the city along what was then a two-lane highway," he says.

The Alfa Romeo not only evokes childhood experiences for Patané, it's also revered for its history.

"The Alfa is a jewel when it comes to vintage cars, but you need to make sure that it's 'honest', meaning no major modifications," says Patané.

Bob, from a bayside suburb in Melbourne, is also an avid collector of vintage cars. In his small but highly coveted "stable" are two rare Bugattis, including a Peugeot Bébé designed by Ettore Bugatti in 1914.

Rebuilt from shell

Bob has meticulously pieced together these cars with what he describes as an "oily rag" look, with original parts sourced from around the world.

The shell of the Bébé was displayed in a tree out the front of a car yard in Sydney until the 1950s and went to a succession of owners, the last being in New Zealand, from where it was finally purchased by Bob.

The other Bugatti, from 1927 and daubed the "Grand Prix," is now estimated to be worth more than \$500,000.

"It's not really about the price," says Bob. "People who own these cars are proud of the provenance and the design."

A bright red A.C. Ace, circa 1960, brings him just as much pleasure. It was purchased from an English owner who kept it for 46 years and is now worth almost as much as the Bugattis.

The car features a two-litre Bristol motor and a sleek and curvaceous body. "It was a highly successful racing car in its time and, as you can see, it's in completely original condition," says Bob, who enjoys being connected to the elements.

"You feel connected to nature when you're behind the wheel. You're not disconnected from the road," he says.

CHACA CLUB PERMIT SCHEME ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

CHACA is a VicRoads authorised Club to participate in the VicRoads Club Permit Scheme (CPS).

VicRoads has set rules to determine the eligibility of vehicles for the Club Permit Scheme. These may be viewed in the CPS handbook or on the VicRoads website. CHACA has set its own additional requirements for vehicles to be submitted for the CPS using CHACA's authorisation. The additional requirements are in line with the original CHACA charter of vehicle originality and preservation.

The following are CHACA's requirements for Members submitting vehicles for CPS assessment.

- 1. The vehicle must have been manufactured prior to 1st December 1992.
- 2. The member submitting the application must have been a CHACA member for at least 3 months.
- 3. Vehicles submitted for CPS application must be as the manufacturer originally designed and built. Some modifications are permitted in line with the original manufacture option list, are period correct, or are based on safety issues, but in all cases must not detract from originality. Replicas derived from a lower model are acceptable as long as the appearance is as original as possible to the intended vehicle model (e.g. GT Falcon from a base Falcon).
- 4. Applicants for the CPS will certify that the vehicle submitted will remain roadworthy during the permit period and unmodified from what was originally submitted.
- 5. Once a vehicle has been accepted by CHACA for CPS it will be the members' responsibility to maintain the vehicle as originally presented, with no further modifications and in a roadworthy condition for all permit renewal applications.
- 6. Determination of the eligibility for any vehicle submitted to CHACA for CPS will be at the discretion of the Committee. Vehicle CPS application must be submitted to the Technical Officer in writing.




When he opened it, he found two crocheted dolls and a stack of money totaling \$95,000. He asked her about the contents.


