PETER HIBBERT'S 1958 ASTON MARTIN

Manufacturer: Aston Martin Lagonda Limited, Newport Pagnell England.

Model: DB2/4 Mk III/4 Coupé. Body Style: 2+2. V.I.N.: AM300/3/1807. Engine No. DBA 1398.



Around mid-year of 1981, I procured this fine English gentleman's 'racer' from a fellow at Glen Waverley who had imported it from UK and owned it for five years. Livery is British racing green (was daffodil) and parchment full leather interior. The frame is of space frame tubing supporting a full alloy body.

I had constructed a spacious two-story home for he and family and, as sometimes can occur during construction, the building contract is varied

adding extra work and of course, relevant costs. The variations were agreed and signed off as a commitment to pay. At completion and my hand over, unfortunately his money pit was drained and I was stuck with his debt. He mentioned the possible option to settle immediately if I seemed interested, that he would offer the mint 1958 Aston Martin to cover the amount. I accepted the offer as the value of the Aston well covered the debt and a settlement was confirmed. I took delivery within the same week.


The picture, featured on the cover of *Your ABCCC News* (August 2015 edition), of the Aston Martin with the 1949 Riley was snapped at my Mother-in-law's home as they were gracious enough to allow storage of both, whilst I was constructing our new home in Vermont South commencing 1982. I built the eight-car garage to lock up first and housed four cars including a pair of 1926 and 1935 Dodges.

I worked on the Aston for a few years doing minor items to raise its standard of finish and performance. It had been restored prior by Melbourne's Dawes and North, in late 1976. It was then well placed in concours events. The odometer reading at my acquisition was 68,500 miles, just 7,000 greater than when restored in Melbourne. The performance was neck-snapping, using the four-speed close ratio gearbox, and then settling into overdrive by a toggle switch on the instrument panel.

I attempted to lower the seat by removing the timber packers to clear my head clouting the roof but was to no avail. In 1990, I sold it to an investor, in England I believe, and it was shipped back to England.

No more English for me thank you!

CLASSICS CONTINUE TO ROLL IN FOR ADELAIDE FESTIVAL TUESDAY 31 JANUARY, 2023

The WRC winning Lancia Rally 037 is one of five classic rally cars entered in the Adelaide Motorsport Festival.

Entries for the ever-popular Adelaide Motorsport Festival continue to grow, with five celebrated cars from the iconic years of Group 4 and Group B now entered in the event.

Taking place in March around the Victoria Park section of the famous Adelaide Street Circuit, the Adelaide Motorsport Festival will welcome a plethora of classic cars from multiple disciplines and eras over a jam-packed weekend.

The latest set of cars to confirm a place in the Invitational class of the event all bear a rich and colourful competition history, including successful stints at the top level around the world.

At the top of the list is the Fiat 131 Abarth, which was built in the late 1970s and went on to win the FIA World Rally Championship (WRC) Manufacturers' title on three occasions - 1977, 1978 and 1980.

Another decorated champion car entered, a Group B Lancia Rally 037, was built at the start of the 1980s and went on to win the 1983 WRC Manufacturers' title – the last rear-wheel drive car to do so.

The next famous set of wheels is an Audi S1 E2 Quattro – a car that revolutionised world rallying in the early 1980s.



A title winning car, Hannu Mikkola (1983) and Stig Blomqvist (1984) both piloted the Audi S1 E2 Quattro to their respective WRC Drivers' titles before Audi withdrew from the championship, with the model heading to Adelaide was built in 1985 and was Audi's last factory Group B car.

Adding to the heralded handful of cars making the way down under is a Renault 5 Turbo that ran in both the Group 4 and Group B eras, which included a victory on debut at the 1981 Monte Carlo Rally.

Rounding out the list is a rare commodity to feature in rally events throughout the Group 4 and Group B eras – a Ferrari 308 GTB.


While the legendary Italian manufacturer is more known for its Formula 1 and Sportscar endeavours, it did dip its toe into the world of rally.

Unfortunately, the results were far from desirable, but the car was still beloved by many rally fans and became a classic due to its stylish design and limited production numbers.

The Adelaide Motorsport Festival takes place at Victoria Park on 25-26 March.



CHACA CLUB PERMIT SCHEME **ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES**

CHACA is a VicRoads authorised Club to participate in the VicRoads Club Permit Scheme (CPS).

VicRoads has set rules to determine the eligibility of vehicles for the Club Permit Scheme. These may be viewed in the CPS handbook or on the VicRoads website. CHACA has set its own additional requirements for vehicles to be submitted for the CPS using CHACA's authorisation. The additional requirements are in line with the original CHACA charter of vehicle originality and preservation.

The following are CHACA's requirements for Members submitting vehicles for CPS assessment.

- 1. The vehicle must have been manufactured prior to 31st December 1992.
- 2. Vehicles submitted for CPS application must be as the manufacturer originally designed and built. Some modifications are permitted in line with the original manufacture option list, are period correct, or are based on safety issues, but in all cases must not detract from originality. Replicas derived from a lower model are acceptable as long as the appearance is as original as possible to the intended vehicle model (e.g. GT Falcon from a base Falcon).
- Applicants for the CPS will certify that the vehicle submitted will remain roadworthy during the 3. permit period and unmodified from what was originally submitted.
- 4. Once a vehicle has been accepted by CHACA for CPS it will be the members' responsibility to maintain the vehicle as originally presented, with no further modifications and in a roadworthy condition for all permit renewal applications.
- 5. Determination of the eligibility for any vehicle submitted to CHACA for CPS will be at the discretion of the Committee. Vehicle CPS application must be submitted to the Technical Officer in
