

1964 CHEVROLET CORVAIR SPYDER

Chevrolet manufactured the Corvair model for 9 years from 1960 to 1969 over two generations. The first generation ran from 1960 to 1964 and the second one from 1965 until the end. It came in different models over the years such as two-door coupe, convertible, four-door sedan, and four- door station wagon body styles, as well as passenger van, commercial van, and pickup truck variants. The Corvair meant to compete with cars such as the Ford Falcon, Studebaker Larks, the Beetle and others but for not being very economical it unfortunately was not able to compete with the other brands.

Chevrolet noticed that the Corvair buyers enjoy the great handling of the car and would prefer more engine power. Based on that feedback Chevrolet introduced 1962 the optional high performance option ("Spyder") that included a turbo charger supplied by Thompson-Ramo-Wooldridge for the coupe (Monza Club) and convertible models.

The Spyder turbo charged engine was able to provide 150 horsepower at 4,400 rpm which was almost 50 percent better than the concurrent 102 bhp "stage two" Corvair engine. The car was able to accelerate from 0 to 60 miles per hour in 10.8 seconds. At that time it was respectable power for a rather cheap car. The Corvair engine was a 145 cubic inch flat six power plant position in the rear of the car.1964 some more improvements were provided such as 164 cubic-inch engine and a transverse leaf springs for the rear suspension.

The Corvair was the first mass produced turbocharged passenger car. Oldsmobile has been beaten Chevrolet with the announcement of the first turbocharged car (F85 Jetfire) by only a few weeks but the Spyder actually went on sale first.

Ralph Nader published in 1965 his book 'Unsafe at Any Speed', a critique on the lack of safety of American-made cars. The first chapter, the chapter that everyone reads, used the 1960 - 1963 Corvair as an example, which gave the car an unsafe reputation. By then Chevrolet already had improved the independent rear suspension and also decided not to perform any further improvement to the car. Basically Chevrolet already decided to shelf the car before the book came out.

By the way the name "Corvair" is a portmanteau of Corvette and Bel Air.

CHACA CLUB PERMIT SCHEME **ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES**

CHACA is a VicRoads authorised Club to participate in the VicRoads Club Permit Scheme (CPS).

VicRoads has set rules to determine the eligibility of vehicles for the Club Permit Scheme. These may be viewed in the CPS handbook or on the VicRoads website. CHACA has set its own additional requirements for vehicles to be submitted for the CPS using CHACA's authorisation. The additional requirements are in line with the original CHACA charter of vehicle originality and preservation.

The following are CHACA's requirements for Members submitting vehicles for CPS assessment.

- 1. The vehicle must have been manufactured prior to 1st December 1992.
- 2. The member submitting the application must have been a CHACA member for at least 3 months.
- 3. Vehicles submitted for CPS application must be as the manufacturer originally designed and built. Some modifications are permitted in line with the original manufacture option list, are period correct, or are based on safety issues, but in all cases must not detract from originality. Replicas derived from a lower model are acceptable as long as the appearance is as original as possible to the intended vehicle model (e.g. GT Falcon from a base Falcon).
- 4. Applicants for the CPS will certify that the vehicle submitted will remain roadworthy during the permit period and unmodified from what was originally submitted.
- 5. Once a vehicle has been accepted by CHACA for CPS it will be the members' responsibility to maintain the vehicle as originally presented, with no further modifications and in a roadworthy condition for all permit renewal applications.
- Determination of the eligibility for any vehicle submitted to CHACA for CPS will be at the discre-6. tion of the Committee. Vehicle CPS application must be submitted to the Technical Officer in writing.



I felt so bad and apologized to the men for being so late. I went to the graveside and looked down, and the vault lid was already in place. I didn't know what else to do, so I started to play. The workers put down their lunches and began to gather around. I played out my heart and soul for this man with no family and no friends. I played like I've never played before for this homeless man.

As I played "Amazing Grace", the workers began to weep. The wept, I wept, and when I'd finished I packed up my bagpipes and headed for the car. Though my head hung low, my heart was full.

As I opened my car door, I heard one of the workers say, "I've never seen anything like that before, and I've been putting in septic tanks for twenty years".




