#### **MEMBER'S CAR**

#### 1973 Porsche 911 RS



Porsche 911 was developed as a replacement for the Porsche 356. It was more powerful, larger and more comfortable. The 911 shape made its public debut in Autumn of 1963 at the Frankfurt Motor Show. Production began in September 1964 and continued through to 1989.

The Carrera 911 RS was created from Porsche's obsession with racing and performance. It was developed to compete in the Group 4 GT class of the then newly established European GT Championship. RS standing for Rennsport, German for race sport. The name was first was used in 1954

The 2.4L Model 911S had already proven it's racing pedigree with success, so it was the obvious choice for further development for the European Championship series. Porsche lined up the Ferrari 365 GTB Daytona 'Competizione' in its crosshairs and set out to design a lighter, more powerful version of the Model 911S that was capable of out-performing the Ferrari on the track.

The design team focused on shaving weight and increasing the power by enlarging the engine to 2687cc that produced 210 horses from its flat six. The interior was very rudimentary, including; no sound deadening and very basic floor covering, door pulls instead of handles and wind-up windows. Fiberglass, thinner steel and glass was used in its production to shave off kilograms.

It was capable of 0 to 100 km/h sprint in 5 seconds and hitting around 255 km/h, very impressive numbers for the day.

Aside from the mechanical upgrades, the Carrera 2.7 RS cars were fitted with a revised and stiffened suspension, and larger brakes. Wider rear fenders were also needed to accommodate the wider rear tyres that helped to put all that power to the road.

The defining feature of the fastest production-built German car of its time was its iconic rear spoiler, now popularly referred to as the "duck tail". The RS was produced in distinctive colours that included; white, bright yellow, orange green as well as blue, with the script colour on the side of the body matching the colour of the Fuchs wheels.



The 911 RS went on to win many championships, proving unbeatable in skilled hands. Today it still remains a very competitive machine, even against more modern cars. It has been voted by many as the ultimate driving experience, the quintessential sports car.

With only 1580 2.7L Carrera RS cars made as well as with many of these used for competition and destroyed, it is no wonder that the original 1973 Carrera RS cars are highly prized amongst enthusiasts.

This car has been recreated to capture the spirit of the 1973 Carrera RS, using some original RS parts and featuring the correct air cooled 2687cc dry sump motor, fitted with the RS specification cam-

shafts and stainless extractors, matched to the 915 five speed gearbox and finished in the crisp Carrera yellow as well as sporting the offset set of Fuchs wheels.

The interior is basic, with simple floor covering, wind up windows, leather strap door pulls, no heating or air conditioning and period seats.

The ride is very firm, the steering is very direct and handling is very precise. The clutch is hard and the engine noise is overwhelming. The pedals are offset to the center and the gears need to be selected purposefully, but it does put a smile on your face every time you get behind the wheel.

It is the ultimate classic Porsche look, delivering raw-boned performance with that great rasping engine sound that only a Porsche flat six can create. Not a matching numbers car, but close enough to deliver the thrill of the factory original.

# Classic car convoy celebrates 60 years of the Mini in Australia

A convoy of Minis is driving from Melbourne to Sydney this week to celebrate 60 years of the beloved car in Australia.

While last year was the actual 60th anniversary, the pandemic has seen celebrations postponed until now.

The car is an icon of 1960s British pop culture, and for many, like convoy co-organiser Roger Bektash, it's been a lifelong passion.

"The mini design has really inspired all the modern four cars we get now," he said.

"All front wheel drives follow the mini principles.

"Of course, they're much more luxurious and even faster now.

"But the mini was a revolutionary car of the time."

# 'They were the most competitive car'

The two-door car was produced by British Motor Corporation and successors from 1959 to 2000.

Australian production first began in 1961 at the company's headquarters at the Nuffield facility at Victoria Park in Sydney.

"The original, in 1961, had a button on the floor to start it," Mr Bektash said.

"Isn't it interesting, you now have a button on the dash to start the modern car.

# "Everything old is new."

It was the best-selling small car in Australia for many years in the 1960s.

And in 1966, the zippy little vehicles won the first nine places at the Bathurst 500 Race outright.

"They were unbeatable," Mr Bektash said.

"All the top drivers of the day drove minis because they were the most competitive car in 1966."

Three years later, Minis were featured in British caper film The Italian Job, further cementing the cars' reputation as pop culture icons.

Convoy to finish in Sydney with a celebration

A small group of Mini enthusiasts set out from Melbourne on Thursday to start the convoy.

They are driving along the old Hume Highway – following the route that existed back in 1961 – and stopping regularly so others can join.

In addition to 60s models, the car drive will feature Minis from throughout the decades, including the Mini Cooper, produced by BMW since 2001.

As for Mr Bektash, he'll be driving a vintage Mini Moke.

"It's the cross country version, the utility version of a Mini, and looks a bit like a tent on wheels," he said.

They will finish with the Minis DownUnder 2021 celebration in Sydney on Sunday, which will feature car clubs from across the country.

"It will be quite a spectacular sight."





# CHACA CLUB PERMIT SCHEME ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

CHACA is a VicRoads authorised Club to participate in the VicRoads Club Permit Scheme (CPS).

VicRoads has set rules to determine the eligibility of vehicles for the Club Permit Scheme. These may be viewed in the CPS handbook or on the VicRoads website. CHACA has set its own additional requirements for vehicles to be submitted for the CPS using CHACA's authorisation. The additional requirements are in line with the original CHACA charter of vehicle originality and preservation.

The following are CHACA's requirements for Members submitting vehicles for CPS assessment.

- 1. The vehicle must have been manufactured prior to 1st December 1992.
- 2. The member submitting the application must have been a CHACA member for at least 3 months.
- 3. Vehicles submitted for CPS application must be as the manufacturer originally designed and built. Some modifications are permitted in line with the original manufacture option list, are period correct, or are based on safety issues, but in all cases must not detract from originality. Replicas derived from a lower model are acceptable as long as the appearance is as original as possible to the intended vehicle model (e.g. GT Falcon from a base Falcon).
- 4. Applicants for the CPS will certify that the vehicle submitted will remain roadworthy during the permit period and unmodified from what was originally submitted.
- 5. Once a vehicle has been accepted by CHACA for CPS it will be the members' responsibility to maintain the vehicle as originally presented, with no further modifications and in a roadworthy condition for all permit renewal applications.
- 6. Determination of the eligibility for any vehicle submitted to CHACA for CPS will be at the discretion of the Committee. Vehicle CPS application must be submitted to the Technical Officer in writing.



Due to VicRoads tightening their control on all Clubs involved with the Club Permit Scheme (CPS) we now request that all members issued with a Permit through CHACA under the new Log Book scheme attend at least one Club Run or Meeting every 6 months **with the Car.** This will assist the Club in ensuring your vehicle continues to meet with all the guidelines and conditions of use as set out by VicRoads and CHACA.

Members are also reminded that the Club is bound by the new rules of this scheme to advise VicRoads of any Permit Holder who is no longer a financial member of the Club. Any queries please contact.





