Car-veat emptor! Collectors warned classic Holdens face export ban as 'Australian protected objects'

A series of vintage Holdens up for auction could face an export ban if they are given "protected" cultural status.

Lloyds Auctions says it plans to put the vehicles under the hammer on Sunday, January 29, as part of a larger classic cars sale.

But the federal government says some of the Holdens – valued in the millions – could be classified as Australian Protected Objects.

The protected status bars objects of significant importance to Australia from being exported.

Other objects that enjoy the same status include sacred Indigenous artefacts, pieces of Ned Kelly's armour and Victoria Cross honours awarded to war veterans.

Lloyds chief operations officer Lee Hames said the collection of vintage cars, which includes the Holdens, is worth tens of millions of dollars.

Foreign bidders beware

"We have notified all foreign bidders and interested parties that they face possible challenges in exporting some of these special classics," he said.

Australian Protected Objects are broken into two tiers, class A and B, with the latter able to be exported with permission from the government.

Class B objects include items of historical significance and art.

Holdens ceased being manufactured in Australia in 2017 following failed negotiations over subsidies between US owner General Motors and the then-Abbott government.

Aston Martin offering new engine parts for their classic cars

The new parts come with documentation certifying they are original, which is important for many owners.

According to a report, Aston Martin's Classic Car Department is offering new engine blocks, cylinder heads and transmissions for a variety of its vintage models. This includes the likes of the DB4, DB5, DB6 and a few select V8 models from the 1960s and 70s.

Reports state that the British car brand has developed new tooling to manufacture many of the parts to match the original specifications. The company has also worked with original suppliers to recreate parts like the transmission, which is supplied by ZF from Germany.

The new parts come with documentation certifying they are original, which is important for many owners trying to maintain the provenance of their models. Aston Martin itself is said to be running a provenance program since 2015 called Aston Martin Assured Provenance. Owners who drive their classic cars on a regular basis can also now easily get modern parts to replace the original, eliminating the risk of destroying them and affecting their resale value.

Huge 230-car barn-find collection set to be auctioned

A staggering collection, secretly stored in a church and gathered over 40 years, is set to be auctioned in the Netherlands

Can you ever have too many cars?

Apparently not, according to a gentleman known only as Mr Palmen, who secretly amassed a huge collection of over 230 cars and other vehicles over the past four decades. Due to his age, he is no longer able to sustain the collection, which is set to be auctioned in May.

According to the auction website, Palmen was a classic vehicle dealer who specialised in 1960s-era cars and had a particular affinity for Italian marques. His collection started with a yellow, 1955 Lancia B20 and grew from there.

Over 230 cars, some mopeds and other equipment are represented in the auction. The cars were stored in two warehouses and a church and kept secret from neighbouring tenants and even friends.

A total of 84 marques are represented, with 20 Alfa Romeos, 13 Lancias, 10 Fiats and a couple of Ferraris supporting Palmen's Italian tastes. There are other European brands, like Jaguar, Peugeot and Mercedes-Benz, as well as American manufacturers like Ford, Cadillac and Chevrolet.

While many of the cars are 'eclectic' classics, like the 1963 Messerschmitt KR200 'bubble car' and the Saab Sonnet III of the early 1970s, there are a number of very valuable machines in the mix, including a pair of 1960s Maserati 3500 coupes, worth well over \$500,000 each.

The auctioneer notes that all the cars were kept in 'as arrived' condition from when they were added to the collection and that Palmen added but never sold any cars. From the photos and video, it is clear that not all cars are in great condition, but given the rarity and originality of many models, collectors and investors are sure to take a strong interest.

The auction starts on May 19 and runs until June 7 2023.

CHACA CLUB PERMIT SCHEME **ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES**

CHACA is a VicRoads authorised Club to participate in the VicRoads Club Permit Scheme (CPS).

VicRoads has set rules to determine the eligibility of vehicles for the Club Permit Scheme. These may be viewed in the CPS handbook or on the VicRoads website. CHACA has set its own additional requirements for vehicles to be submitted for the CPS using CHACA's authorisation. The additional requirements are in line with the original CHACA charter of vehicle originality and preservation.

The following are CHACA's requirements for Members submitting vehicles for CPS assessment.

- 1. The vehicle must have been manufactured prior to 31st December 1992.
- 2. Vehicles submitted for CPS application must be as the manufacturer originally designed and built. Some modifications are permitted in line with the original manufacture option list, are period correct, or are based on safety issues, but in all cases must not detract from originality. Replicas derived from a lower model are acceptable as long as the appearance is as original as possible to the intended vehicle model (e.g. GT Falcon from a base Falcon).
- Applicants for the CPS will certify that the vehicle submitted will remain roadworthy during the 3. permit period and unmodified from what was originally submitted.
- 4. Once a vehicle has been accepted by CHACA for CPS it will be the members' responsibility to maintain the vehicle as originally presented, with no further modifications and in a roadworthy condition for all permit renewal applications.
- 5. Determination of the eligibility for any vehicle submitted to CHACA for CPS will be at the discretion of the Committee. Vehicle CPS application must be submitted to the Technical Officer in


