
It is with great disappointment we advise you of the recent decision by the RACV to cease their Motoring Interests Program.

This program has been a beacon for many clubs, connecting the motoring enthusiast with communities across Victoria. In fact, many people may not own their current veteran, vintage or classic vehicles without the awareness that this program and its supported events have created.

Of special acknowledgment is the personal dedication to this program by Daryl Meek. Many of you would have worked with Daryl on events large and small. Daryl's commitment and passion for historic motoring and our club's events is without parallel. Daryl leaves the RACV at the end of the month with fond memories that we, as motoring clubs, have been a part of. Please join me in thanking Daryl for his tireless enthusiasm, expertise, energy, and friendship over the 7 years in this role.

The Association is disappointed by the decision of the RACV to terminate this essential and worthwhile program linking the Victorian community, motoring culture and history.

Edited Minutes of the AOMC meeting October 12 2020. Chaired by Iain Ross.

RACV: Daryl Meek is leaving the organisation and the Motoring Interests department is being disbanded, leaving future support of the movement in doubt.

John Johnson (Volvo CC) remarked that this could put Australia Day in jeopardy. Iain responded that it looks in doubt, not sure what is happening.

Engine Number Records Service: This facility has been closed during the lockdown. 20 current applications are being held over until the records can be accessed again.

VicRoads/CPS & Guest Speaker: Iain Ross introduced John Lewis (JL) from VicRoads.

John started by pointing out that Road Safety Regulations are reviewed every 10 years. There will be some changes in October and more next year. There is not much foreseen to changes in the club Permit Scheme regulations, unless money becomes available to transfer the CPS database to the main database. Changes are as follows:

- Formalising the disallowing of commercial use of CPS vehicles. VicRoads will take strong action on this in the future. There has been complaints about CPS vehicles being used for reward in weddings and gardening services.
- Due to issues with production, a fee for first issue plates for permit vehicles will be introduced. Plates for Vintage will be at half cost, as only 1 plate is issued. Cost will be \$38.10 (\$19 Vintage).
- VicRoads will have the power to issue permits with conditions. For example, vehicles without lights will not be allowed to operate at night, and vehicles with steel wheels will have restricted road use.
- The introduction of Slim Line Plates for CPS vehicles. They will be in the same number series as the club permit plates, and will be issued on a next out of the box basis. Still working on the processes, and may be able to offer replacement plates (same number as full reg). They are still undergoing camera testing. They failed first time around and police will not approve them until they pass the test.
- Reassignment of deceased permit holder's permit to surviving spouse. This has been happening even though not in the regulations, but will now be recognised in the regulations.
- Renewing Club Permit online has been introduced. To do this you need to have a myvicroads account. Signatures are still required and log book issued, but payment can be made online. System can also allow for signatures to be provided online as well.
- Change of eligibility requirement from financial member to member. This was done because VicRoads were being used as a debt collector for clubs. It is still up to the club to determine if permit holder is a member or not.

There will be an obligation on CPS holders to notify within 14 days of any changes of details (address, etc.) An email has been sent out to all clubs detailing these changes.

Ouestions from the floor:

Warwick Truepenny (Norton Owners Club) noted that the model rules state that if membership is not paid within a certain time they become a non-member. He also asked about the status of life members. **John Lewis (JL)** responded that it is up to the clubs to decide on membership status.

Andrew McDougall (Veteran CC) asked if there was any thought to doing away with the paper windscreen labels, as in open veteran vehicles they are easily spoiled when they get wet. **JL** responded that there has been some debate about the retention of labels, but they will continue to use them as the feeling is that CPS holders prefer to retain them. He will take on board the issue with paper labels being easily damaged.

Andrew referred to taking part in single and twin veteran runs from Perth to Sydney and from Adelaide to Darwin. On these runs he used a flashing illuminated light on the back of his vehicle to warn fast approaching traffic from the rear that there was a slow moving hazard ahead. Whilst on these runs, mixing with big trucks and road trains, he received lots of compliments from passing truck drivers who appreciated the warning. He is looking to recommend it be allowed for slow moving vehicles in Victoria. **JL** responded that he has spoken to compliance engineers on this issue, and they do not support anything apart from standard lights on vehicles, as they consider it would cause confusion.

Iain Ross suggested that the best thing is to show the engineers what is happening on the road with slow moving vehicles. JL added that he is happy to continue the discussion.

Carl Jones (Mercedes Benz Club Vic.) thanked John and VicRoads for the scheme. With the eventual amalgamation of the database, could black and white plates be available for CPS vehicles. **JL** responded that CPS vehicles need to be readily identifiable on the road, particularly to monitor commercial use and log book compliance.

Gareth Walker (RS Owners Club) reported that in his club there has been a lot of problems when CPS holders change address, and subsequently renewals do not arrive at new address. **JL** responded that the issue with over the counter renewals and changes is that because the CPS database is separate and needs updating independently this is sometimes overlooked. VicRoads have now introduced an electronic renewal system through myvicroads which can be used to change details such as addresses. You can also check your details including which vehicles are registered under your name.

Rod Amos (Vintage Sports Car Club) queried the use of electronic renewals and the need for signatures on the renewals. **JL** responded that you still need to upload club endorsement of your renewal. This can be done by scanning the signed documents and this can then be uploaded onto the electronic system. Several delegates reported that they have used the system and have found that it worked well.

John Johnson (Volvo CC) asked if with deceased estate transfer of permits to spouse, could this be extended to include sons and daughters. JL responded that no, it cannot be extended to other family members. It has merely been brought into line with the situation with full registration and is in place because spouses are considered to be joint owners of a vehicle. If transferred to another family member the usual procedures and costs associated with vehicle transfers applies.

What is the criteria with stickers with Left hand Drive vehicles? I have a 35yo LHD vehicle. **JL** responded that ADRs do not allow for vehicles under 30yo to be LHD. VicRoads have introduced a process whereby 25 to 30yo LHD vehicles can be registered on the CPS following inspection, but cannot be put on full registration.

Can I drive my CPS vehicle to my place of work? **JL** responded that you can as long as your log book is filled out, However if that vehicle is used to do deliveries on the way to work that is unacceptable.

Peter Ramage (Williamstown Motorcycle Club) reported that he likes to pay his bills as soon as they arrive. However, with his CPS renewals, when he tries to pay as soon as paperwork arrives, he is told he cannot as it is seen to be currently fully paid up. **JL** responded that under the VicRoads system, payments can only be made within 4 weeks of the renewal date

David Smallacombe (Morris Register) asked if you are on a 4 day club rally, can you prefill your logbook to cover each day or do you need to fill out each day. JL responded that you must fill out each day separately on each day of use.

Pick of the Day is a full classic: 1932 Lincoln KB

Car also carries limousine coachwork by Willoughby

So, you're ready to venture into the world of what the Classic Car Club of America calls full classics? The Pick of the Day is a 1932 Lincoln KB that appears to be a turnkey — and 5-figure — way to step up to the higher echelons of the collector car hobby.

Being advertised by a private seller in St. Louis, Missouri, is this Lincoln KB with coachwork by Willoughby.

"This car has a 448 cid V12, producing 150hp," the seller points out. "These engines were hand made to order and are Mill/Forkand-Blade connecting rods. Lincoln touted this engine to propel the car at speeds above 100 mph. This made the Lincoln V12 one of the most powerful power plants of it's time."

Not only that, but "This Lincoln has a Willoughby body that was hand made to order. The Willoughby craftmanship is unsurpassed by no one in its time. This car has amenities that were only for the elite."

The seller offers a list of features: "Microphone to speak with driver, switched interior lighting, cigarette station with lighter,

makeup station, buzzer for driver, retractable foot rest, shaded sun visors, dual horn, heater, retractable shades on all rear windows, fold-down jump seats with nickel plated arm rest, thermostat lurers on engine cover, power/mechanical brakes, dual side mount spare tires, Dual side mirrors, glass divider windows, leather front seat, cloth rear seats, and all real wood trim throughout."





The seller reports that only 56 Willoughby limousine bodies were produced, and that such cars sold new for \$5,905, a grand more than those by LeBaron and about 10 times the price of atypical new car in the early 1930s.

Willoughby and Co. was established in Utica, New York, in 1903, and prepared several cars for American presidents (Coolidge and Hoover), as well as for boxer Joe Louis.

The seller adds that this Lincoln was purchased by "a man in the New York area" in the 1970s and in 2000, that owner put the

car through a complete restoration, spending more than \$250,000.

After that work was completed, the car "was a national show winner."

"This car is the real deal. Pictures do not do it justice. I would say it is a high 9 out of 10 and to get it to a 10 would not take much work. All the chrome on this car is spotless/paint is near flawless. The vinyl top is flawless. The original makeup and cigarette case are in the car with the original perfume jars. "The drive train is perfect," the seller adds.





"I have owned this car since May 2017, and it has been a pleasure. I am now selling it to move on to other hobbies."

CHACA CLUB PERMIT SCHEME ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

CHACA is a VicRoads authorised Club to participate in the VicRoads Club Permit Scheme (CPS).

VicRoads has set rules to determine the eligibility of vehicles for the Club Permit Scheme. These may be viewed in the CPS handbook or on the VicRoads website. CHACA has set its own additional requirements for vehicles to be submitted for the CPS using CHACA's authorisation. The additional requirements are in line with the original CHACA charter of vehicle originality and preservation.

The following are CHACA's requirements for Members submitting vehicles for CPS assessment.

- 1. The vehicle must have been manufactured prior to 1st December 1992.
- 2. The member submitting the application must have been a CHACA member for at least 3 months.
- 3. Vehicles submitted for CPS application must be as the manufacturer originally designed and built. Some modifications are permitted in line with the original manufacture option list, are period correct, or are based on safety issues, but in all cases must not detract from originality. Replicas derived from a lower model are acceptable as long as the appearance is as original as possible to the intended vehicle model (e.g. GT Falcon from a base Falcon).
- 4. Applicants for the CPS will certify that the vehicle submitted will remain roadworthy during the permit period and unmodified from what was originally submitted.
- 5. Once a vehicle has been accepted by CHACA for CPS it will be the members' responsibility to maintain the vehicle as originally presented, with no further modifications and in a roadworthy condition for all permit renewal applications.
- 6. Determination of the eligibility for any vehicle submitted to CHACA for CPS will be at the discretion of the Committee. Vehicle CPS application must be submitted to the Technical Officer in writing.

Online Club Permit Renewals



VicRoads is launching new digital functionality that will enable Club Permits to be renewed online from 31 July 2020.

How to renew a Club permit online

You can renew a Club Permit online with a myVicRoads account. If you don't have a myVicRoads account, go to

www.vicroads.vic.gov.au to find out more.

Simply upload the signed renewal and make the payment. This new online service removes the need for Club Permit holders to visit a Customer Service Centre or to renew via mail.

Important information:

Requirements to renew a Club Permit remains the same


The renewal must be signed by an authorised officer of the club/association to declare that the permit holder is a current member of that particular club/association. The Club Permit renewal must also be signed by the Club Permit holder.

Proof of payment

When a Club Permit is renewed online, the receipt must be printed and kept with the log book they received with renewal. The receipt may need to be produced as proof of payment.

Changing period of use

If the Club Permit holder wishes to change the period of use from 45 days to 90 days or 90 days to 45 days, the renewal cannot be processed online.


