# PETER HIBBERT'S 1948 MERCURY SERIES 89M (FORD) FOUR DOOR SEDAN HISTORY, 01/11/2021.

This is an account of history (as known) of purchase, ownership & restorations.

My attraction to an early Mercury began when I was a member of the 11th Caulfield Scout Group that conducted meetings at Carnegie.

Among the group was a mate's father who owned the same model having the body colour black that he used as a limousine for hire & often drove a few of us around including to Scout camping trips & Jamboree's. We would all cram into it up to 10 + the assistant Scout Master & off we go in the big strong powerful Mercury.

During early 1985, that memory prompted me to seek out one to restore & I read an article in an early issue of Custom Rodder magazine issue 68/1982 of Elwyn Stanley Kerle's Thagoona Queensland based Strata Blue body colour Sedan telling of some history including that it was bought by his brother for \$50 in 1973 from a local car dealer.



It went on to tell of mate Warren Keith buying it with the intention of using the engine (#2639804E) & running gear to build a hot rod but because of the Machinery Departments specifications, the scheme was scrapped.

It was left untouched for a few years being stored at Elwyn's home & he decided to buy it from Warren & restore it to running condition mainly because of his passion for Ford products & possible future collector value. It was a part time project as funds allowed.

Elwyn had painted all the running gear orange & fitted a new vinyl trimmed interior. (I later painted all the running gear to factory satin black).

He attended a few Hot Rod outings & enjoyed showing it proving very reliable & enjoyable.

It arrived with the alloy wheels & I then fitted the correct 15" wheels & rag type tyres including 'flapper' type white walls & sold the 4 alloys/tyres.

At my later request, Elwyn wrote a comprehensive 9 page hand written history of all work carried out on the Mercury.

On the 10th July 1986, I replied with gratitude of his history experience & it is on my file however, far too much to include in this account.

He later offered it for sale at \$5,000 ONO to another person. It then had a 1942 239 cubic inch S/V F/H engine/3 speed stock transmission.

As a result of that advertisement, it was purchased during 1985 by Brian Leembruggen of Raceview, Queensland.

I enquired of buying it & Brian mailed me a stack of photos of the alloy later style wheels how it was then which I copied & returned.

He preferred to keep the stock wheeled images. I agreed at April 1985 on a delivered purchase price to Melbourne of \$7120.



During 1985, Tom Coulter (DEC') of The Early Ford V8 Club of Vic sent me an invitation letter & Membership Application Form to join the club.

I mentioned to Tom I will restore the Mercury first, obtain a RWC & eventually joining the club mid 1986 & hold a life continuous membership of 35 years.

I have copious restoration records of & owned & enjoyed it over decades.

I restored the Mercury altering the body paint colour from Strata Blue to black & it being in very good condition & I drove it for 21 years.

I can upon request, prepare a list of copious tasks keeping restoring & maintaining it in a fine safe running order.

I have many progressive photographic memories to share.

Our family has enjoyed the interstate journeys, National events & weekends away with club members & their families.

It was sold to a Melbourne purchaser. My enquiries have failed to discover it's whereabouts of late.

My project at the moment is a 48 delux utility which has all the bodywork done and most mechanicals at this stage.

#### The Melbourne company breathing new life into old four-wheel drives

Could old petrol and diesel drinking cars converted to electric vehicles be the future of classic motoring?

The automotive landscape is changing at an incredible rate. In the face of tighter restrictions around emissions and pollution, car manufacturers are turning to electric power for the future.

While petrol and diesel, used in an 'internal combustion engine', has been the rock on which the automotive industry has been built for well over a century, we're currently in the midst of an electric revolution.

New electric cars, from the likes of Tesla, Hyundai, Porsche and Mercedes-Benz are seen as the pinnacle of technology and modern motoring.

But, in the face of this futuristic revolution, classic cars and four-wheel drives are becoming something of an accidental poster-child of the electric vehicle movement.

Classic and vintage Land Rovers are being drawn from paddocks and sheds around the world and are now being reimagined as electric vehicles for the modern era.

Jaunt Motors is one such outfit, based in the Melbourne suburb of Williamstown.

Founded by Marteen Burger and Dave Budge in 2018 – neither of whom had any automotive industry

experience previously – the company is now booked out until mid-2023 on conversion projects. Now, Jaunt Motors is working hard to expand and streamline its production capacity.

Turning an old Land Rover into one of Jaunt's final products involves extensive restoring and reconditioning of the existing chassis and mechanicals, except for the engine, of course.



.A 90kW/240Nm electric motor bolts onto the original gearbox, which means the capable four-wheel drive system remains intact.

Driving range between recharges starts at around 100 kilometres, but this can be extended to up to 400 kilometres in some instances.



Jaunt says old Land Rovers provide the perfect canvas for electrification.

"Aluminium panels means they've not rusted. A bodyon-frame construction makes them easy to work on. They're built to carry heavy loads, meaning we can install a lot of batteries.

"There's an extensive parts network as many components remained unchanged for 50 years. They're still

affordable to purchase and available nationwide. And they have an iconic, nostalgic shape, that inspires adventure."

Prices for a Jaunt Land Rover start from around \$120,000 for a more modern Defender, while the older Series model is more expensive at \$200,000.

Jaunt's electric creations proved the perfect vehicle for David Jackson, who works in Melbourne's technology sector.

"I think the first thing was, I was looking for something with a bit of soul..." Mr Jackson explained. "There are so many bland, commoditised, vehicles on the road out there."

Jackson stumbled across Jaunt's first design, a shortwheelbase Land Rover named Juniper, and found exactly what he was looking for.



"The idea of something that was a bit different and had a bit of a story behind it... it was emotive and elegant and timeless, and so I really resonated with that."

While many drive an electric car for its zero tailpipe emissions and environmental impacts, Jackson was drawn to the silent running and smooth experience of driving his wife's electric car.

"I love the serenity of driving it. It's so Zen to be in it," he said. "And I love the experience of electric, being able to charge at home, not having to go to a petrol station.

"When I chatted to Dave [at Jaunt] and understood the Jaunt story, that was what finally got me across the line.

"I just loved the idea of the re-use, all this aluminium and steel that would otherwise be just sitting around in a paddock going to waste. To bring that back to life just seemed like a really, really nice story to me, and so I liked that journey."

When Jackson finally takes delivery of his new-old Jaunt EV, he will use it for the short commute to

work when the weather or his schedule precludes walking.

And while it might head off down the coast every once in a while – Jackson has opted for a longer-range battery pack – the Jaunt EV will spend the majority of its time on short journeys around town.

Jaunt's business model mirrors a growing trend around the world where classic and vin-



tage cars – and old Land Rovers in particular – are becoming something of a poster child for the electrification movement.

The take up of electric cars in Australia remains a small portion of the overall new car market. But, it is growing.

Last year to the end of September, Australians had bought 1225 new electric vehicles. That number has grown to 3568 this year, representing an increase of 191 per cent. It should be noted these numbers exclude sales of Teslas, the American manufacturer not disclosing its sales to authorities.

But, thanks to companies like Jaunt Motors and if other parts of the world are anything to go by, an electric automotive future might come to Australia sooner than you think. And it could be old cars – silently – showing the way.

#### CHACA CLUB PERMIT SCHEME ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

CHACA is a VicRoads authorised Club to participate in the VicRoads Club Permit Scheme (CPS).

VicRoads has set rules to determine the eligibility of vehicles for the Club Permit Scheme. These may be viewed in the CPS handbook or on the VicRoads website. CHACA has set its own additional requirements for vehicles to be submitted for the CPS using CHACA's authorisation. The additional requirements are in line with the original CHACA charter of vehicle originality and preservation.

The following are CHACA's requirements for Members submitting vehicles for CPS assessment.

- 1. The vehicle must have been manufactured prior to 1st December 1992.
- 2. The member submitting the application must have been a CHACA member for at least 3 months.
- 3. Vehicles submitted for CPS application must be as the manufacturer originally designed and built. Some modifications are permitted in line with the original manufacture option list, are period correct, or are based on safety issues, but in all cases must not detract from originality. Replicas derived from a lower model are acceptable as long as the appearance is as original as possible to the intended vehicle model (e.g. GT Falcon from a base Falcon).
- 4. Applicants for the CPS will certify that the vehicle submitted will remain roadworthy during the permit period and unmodified from what was originally submitted.
- 5. Once a vehicle has been accepted by CHACA for CPS it will be the members' responsibility to maintain the vehicle as originally presented, with no further modifications and in a roadworthy condition for all permit renewal applications.
- 6. Determination of the eligibility for any vehicle submitted to CHACA for CPS will be at the discretion of the Committee. Vehicle CPS application must be submitted to the Technical Officer in writing.



While sitting wherever you are, lift your right foot off the floor and make clockwise circles in the air.


Now with your right hand, draw the number 6 in the air.





