

#### Low-mileage 1973 Mazda RX-4 classic hits the market for \$150,000

It may not be unusual to see an exotic car in this condition, but it is rare to find a mainstream Japanese sports car from the 1970s like this. A 1973 Mazda RX-4 – one of Mazda's most luxurious coupes of the mid-1970s – with a mere 6397 kilometres on the clock has gone up for sale.



Originally sold in its home country of Japan under the Luce badge, the Mazda uses a 1.2-litre '12A' twin -rotor engine – the same found in early RX-7 sports cars – which powers the rear wheels through a four-speed manual transmission.

Offered by Oldtimer Australia for \$149,950, the Jewel Green RX-4 is reportedly in original condition, with the last recorded registration being in 1985 – after which the vehicle was stored, before being imported into Australia by an avid Mazda enthusiast in 2003.

Presented like a time capsule, the Mazda coupe still has the original protective plastics on the door trims, indicator stalk, and sun visor, while the front seats also feature the quintessentially Japanese seat 'doilies' over the top of the plastic.

The cabin also features an eight-track Clarion cassette player, original jack and toolkit, and the seller is offering the car's original Bridgestone tyres with the sale – though a set of Firestone tyres were fitted to the RX-4 upon its arrival in Australia.

This man owned and drove the same car for 82 years. Can you imagine even having the same car for 82 years?

Mr. Allen Swift of Springfield, Massachusetts received this 1928 Rolls-Royce Piccadilly-P1 Roadster from his father, brand new, as a graduation gift in 1928. He drove it up until his death at the age of 102! He was the oldest living owner of a car that was purchased new.

Just thought you'd like to see it. It was donated to a Springfield museum after his death. It has 1,070,000 miles on it, still runs like a Swiss watch, dead silent at any speed, and is in perfect cosmetic condition.

82 years . . . that's approximately 13,048 miles per year (1,087 per month.) 1,070,000 -- that's miles, not kilometres.

That's British engineering of a bygone era.

I don't think they make 'em like this anymore!

They were one of the cheapest cars you could buy at the time, even so they were well built and reliable. And the most economic to run. 5 gallons used to last forever it seemed. Very good at todays fuel prices.

#### CHACA CLUB PERMIT SCHEME **ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES**

CHACA is a VicRoads authorised Club to participate in the VicRoads Club Permit Scheme (CPS).

VicRoads has set rules to determine the eligibility of vehicles for the Club Permit Scheme. These may be viewed in the CPS handbook or on the VicRoads website. CHACA has set its own additional requirements for vehicles to be submitted for the CPS using CHACA's authorisation. The additional requirements are in line with the original CHACA charter of vehicle originality and preservation.

The following are CHACA's requirements for Members submitting vehicles for CPS assessment.

- 1. The vehicle must have been manufactured prior to 1st December 1992.
- 2. Vehicles submitted for CPS application must be as the manufacturer originally designed and built. Some modifications are permitted in line with the original manufacture option list, are period correct, or are based on safety issues, but in all cases must not detract from originality. Replicas derived from a lower model are acceptable as long as the appearance is as original as possible to the intended vehicle model (e.g. GT Falcon from a base Falcon).
- Applicants for the CPS will certify that the vehicle submitted will remain roadworthy during the 3. permit period and unmodified from what was originally submitted.
- 4. Once a vehicle has been accepted by CHACA for CPS it will be the members' responsibility to maintain the vehicle as originally presented, with no further modifications and in a roadworthy condition for all permit renewal applications.
- 5. Determination of the eligibility for any vehicle submitted to CHACA for CPS will be at the discretion of the Committee. Vehicle CPS application must be submitted to the Technical Officer in


