# Electric 'crate motor' turns any classic into an EV

A new plug-and-play 'crate motor' promises to turn essentially any car into an electric vehicle.

The market for electrified classic vehicles is growing, thanks to cars like the Jaguar E-Type Zero and the Aston Martin DB5 EV that starred at the 2018 Royal Wedding.

Homemade conversions with repurposed Tesla batteries are also becoming increasingly common. Swindon Powertrain wants to make it easier for low-volume manufacturers to create elec-



tric versions of classic, rare, and unique vehicles.



compact, high-power EV powertrains they could source in low to mid volume, leading to a vacuum of supply," said Swindon Powertrain managing director, Raphael Caille.

"When you factor in development costs, specialist."

"To date, niche manufacturers have not had access to

"When you factor in development costs, specialist OEMs haven't been able to electrify their vehicles as quickly as they would like."

"Our ready-to-install 'crate' powertrain will accelerate EV adoption in sectors poorly served by the larger tier one manufacturers and integrators," he added. Swindon Powertrains says its 'crate' motor – made up of a motor, inverter, single-speed transmission, and cooling system – will slot into cars as small as a classic Mini, or into vehicles like quad bikes.

It outputs 80kW, and can be mated with a lithium-ion battery of essentially any size. Remember, plug-and-play.

The development team already builds an original Mini with its in-house motor, with 125mile (200km) of range from its 24kWh battery pack. The 98km/h sprint takes 9.2 seconds, and Swindon Powertrain says the original 68/32 (front/rear) weight distribution has been changed to a more balanced 57/43.



# Inside the largest private collection of cop cars and police memorabilia

Some collect sneakers, some stamps. Terry Fitzgerald and his 18 mates collect cop cars.



The collection, called the NSW Historic Patrol Vehicles, comprises of 62 vehicles and 22 motorcycles. (9News)

Tony and co's collection, which they call NSW Historic Patrol Vehicles, stretches beyond the already crammed space where we stand today, where cars are double stacked against the walls.

"At the moment, we've got 62 vehicles and 22 motorcycles, plus all the uniforms, equipment and everything else we've gathered."

That can mean old police station signage, now hanging lit from a nearby support, or the original heavy wood front counter that would be anchored inside the station, complete with charge book and bail stamp.

The collection embraces the golden era of Australian muscle cars.

"A lot of these cars are enthusiast models; back then, they were police vehicles as well."

Not so much the Mini Cooper General Duties car.

"Imagine those days, they were six foot, six foot two tall minimum, and they actually climbed into a little mini."



The Ford 351 Coupe is probably the motoring opposite of the Mini.

"When Ford came first and second in Bathurst that year, that's when the police were issued with these as well."

The unmarked detectives, Torana had two major tells, as they say in poker, when a mannerism can give you up.

"If you were a smart crim, and you saw the antenna in the centre, and the registration sticker had a 3, you'd back off; the centre antenna is a cop radio, and all police vehicles at that time, were registered in March," reveals Tony.

Pride of place is a Valiant Charger and Kawasaki Z1000, the '70s car and bike Highway Patrol quinella. Behind the Charger sits the first speed radar unit, a box on a heavy wooden tripod. On the bike, a large



speaker is mounted between the handlebars for the police radio.

Tony Psarakis is a former Highway Patrolman, and has been astride the Z1000.


"When you got something coming over the radio, you'd have to turn off the sirens to listen to what they were saying," says Tony.

The collectors are in agreeance that they want their passion for police wheels shown

to the world, and plans are well afoot to establish a formal exhibit space, to host this history of the NSW Police.

"The aim is to refurbish the place, and have a public museum, so the public can actually see all this," says Tony.

# WORLD FAMOUS CLASSIC PORSCHE RESTORER FINALLY COMING TO AUSTRALIA

Great news for 911 fans. Jamie Weiss DMARGE Thursday 17th June, 2021




The Porsche 911 is one of the most iconic vehicles of all time. Famed around the globe for its impeccable looks, great handling and spirited performance, many would consider it the perfect sports car. So how can you improve on perfection?

That's the question Singer Vehicle Design has been answering with aplomb for the last twelve years. Founded in 2009 by Rob Dickinson, former frontman of the English rock band Catherine Wheel and noted Porsche tragic, the Los Angeles-based firm specialises in rebuilding, restoring and modifying classic 911s, and has quickly become recognised as perhaps the world's best classic Porsche restorer. While Singer has long offered its services to both American and European 911 owners, Aussies have long been forced to wistfully look on, unable to receive their Midas touch. Until now, that is.

In collaboration with Melbourne-based luxury car importer and dealer Zagame Automotive Group, the famed Californian restoration outfit's brilliant products will now finally be available in Australia (as well as in New Zealand), with a new showroom – the location of which is yet to be announced – set to feature a customer service team, maintenance facilities, and a small number of display cars, CarAdvice reports.

Singer's bread and butter is taking 964 Targas or Coupes – the version of the classic 911 produced from 1989 to 1994 – and turning them into absolute works of art. All Porsches that get the Singer treatments are of course bespoke, but there are a few key Singer design choices that are consistent between their customisations.

Much of a Singer job's bodywork is replaced with carbon fibre and their classic air-cooled flat-six engines get reworked by noted tuners such as Cosworth and Williams to produce significantly more power. They substitute the long hood of the Porsche 911 classic for the 964's stock short hood, and often relocate the fuel filler door to the bonnet, too – a nod to historic Porsche race cars. Famously, Singer tachometers go to 11, a Spiñal Tap reference (even though engine redline is 7,900rpm).



Customers generally provide their own donor vehicle, but Singer and Zagame are planning to bring a small number of display models Down Under as well. There's already one Singer custom job on the ground in New Zealand, and Singer has also shared on Instagram that "the first restoration for an owner in Australia will arrive later in 2021."

Don't expect it to be a cheap process, however. Singer's services usually cost upwards of 650,000 USD (~850,000 AUD), and 964s are already rather expensive cars to get your hands on here: the cheapest 964 on Carsales right now, a 1992 automatic coupe, is asking 124,000 AUD. One of our DMARGE correspondents has suggested that news of Singer's arrival will push domestic 964 prices even higher, too.





# CHACA CLUB PERMIT SCHEME **ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES**

CHACA is a VicRoads authorised Club to participate in the VicRoads Club Permit Scheme (CPS).

VicRoads has set rules to determine the eligibility of vehicles for the Club Permit Scheme. These may be viewed in the CPS handbook or on the VicRoads website. CHACA has set its own additional requirements for vehicles to be submitted for the CPS using CHACA's authorisation. The additional requirements are in line with the original CHACA charter of vehicle originality and preservation.

The following are CHACA's requirements for Members submitting vehicles for CPS assessment.

- 1. The vehicle must have been manufactured prior to 1st December 1992.
- 2. The member submitting the application must have been a CHACA member for at least 3 months.
- 3. Vehicles submitted for CPS application must be as the manufacturer originally designed and built. Some modifications are permitted in line with the original manufacture option list, are period correct, or are based on safety issues, but in all cases must not detract from originality. Replicas derived from a lower model are acceptable as long as the appearance is as original as possible to the intended vehicle model (e.g. GT Falcon from a base Falcon).
- 4. Applicants for the CPS will certify that the vehicle submitted will remain roadworthy during the permit period and unmodified from what was originally submitted.
- Once a vehicle has been accepted by CHACA for CPS it will be the members' responsibility to 5. maintain the vehicle as originally presented, with no further modifications and in a roadworthy condition for all permit renewal applications.
- Determination of the eligibility for any vehicle submitted to CHACA for CPS will be at the discre-6. tion of the Committee. Vehicle CPS application must be submitted to the Technical Officer in writing.







