Good evening everyone, 2012 continued to be a very busy year for me mainly due to the changes brought about with the introduction of the Log Book scheme for the Club Permitted cars.

As expected the Log Book scheme has brought in a lot of new registrations. There were 60 new registrations during the year as against 36 last year and 12 the previous year. At present we have a total of 205 cars on Club plate. In June this year we introduced the need for members to submit 3 photographs of their Club Permitted cars; the 3 being 3/4 view of the front right, the rear left and the engine

being 3/4 view of the front right, the rear left and the engine of the size 15x10 cm (6"x4") in prints. We have photographs of all cars registered on Club Permit since June 2012 in our files. During the year also introduced the need for members to attend at least two club functions with the car during the calendar year and we are happy to see good attendance at Club Runs. During runs and meetings please make sure that you sign the attendance register with the details of your car.


Following the guided tours, we spread out around the area near the car park for lunch. Very pleasant sitting in the sunshine, chatting and relaxing.

Tariff Concession on Old Car Parts Revoked.

Affects Veteran, Vintage, Classic & Historic Cars.

For many years the old car hobby has had the benefit of a Tariff Concession on parts imported into Australia for vehicles over 30 years old, but as of May 2012 this concession was revoked and the relevant parts will now attract a minimum 5% duty plus the GST. The cost of the imported parts needed to maintain or restore historic cars will thus rise, especially if those parts are from the UK, Europe or Asia.

For some enthusiasts a 5% increase on parts may affect their ability to complete a restoration to the standard desired, or perhaps to complete it at all. For some it may also make the difference between keeping their historic car running and on the road, especially if a major and expensive component is required from overseas.

The revoking of the Tariff Concession Order will also affect the sellers of car parts to the hobby, many being small specialist businesses who largely rely on the support of motor enthusiasts.

Exception: If the vehicle parts are made in the US from US materials it has been suggested bt several commentators that they should be covered under the US/Aust. Free Trade Agreement. If you are bringing parts in from the US it is recommended that the supplier identify US manufactured goods on the invoice and supply the Free Trade Agreement Declaration.

Why has the Concession been revoked? Mr Andrew Mumberson, manager Tariff Operations, Tariff Concessions, Australian Customs and Border Protection Service in response to a query from Jeff Mills of MustangTech.com commented: "The Tariff Concession Orders (TCOs) were listed for revocation as all of them are legally invalid."

Apparently Customs identified this problem during a review of the Australian Tariff Classifications against internationally used Tariff Classification and so decided to revoke TCOs in their entirety because of incorrect wording or where multiple items were listed on one Tariff Concession Order.

The Consequence. It would seem that enthusiasts will have to accept a 5% rise in the cost of imported parts, if Customs receives no substantial opposing comments or encouragement to re-endorse an appropriate set of Tariff Concession Orders for old car parts.

This has sort of happened before, so the government can fix it. On October 18 1994 changes were implemented to regulation 185 of the Regulations (Statutory Rules 1994 No 351 refers)... One unintended

result of the amendment was the revocation of existing TCOs for parts for vehicles at least 30 years of age which also have a general rate of 15%. These TCOs has allowed importers of replacement parts for cars such as vintage, classic and veteran cars duty free entry on these products. The Government approved amendments to the Regulations to restore eligibility for parts of passenger motor vehicles where such vehicles are at least 30 years of age.

What can be done this time? Unfortunately the 'intention to revoke' the TCO seems to have largely gone under the radar of the old car movement with little publicity enabling comment by June 13. Without direct and vocal communication from State and national car club councils, car clubs and individual enthusiasts it would seem that Australian Customs will allow the Concessional Tariff for old car parts to fade away. So, whether you own a 1915 or a 1982 car, respond now and communicate your opinion to: Tariff Operations at Australian Customs (tarcon@customs.gov.au); your local Federal member of Parliament; your Australian supplier of spare parts for your car.

Stolen Car Story

I have listed the story below for car clubs as I hope this could be put into the clubs' magazine, not only to provide assistance to myself but also to advise others that your cars are not always safe, and if you think your car is so rare that no one would possibly steal it, there are obviously people out there who don't care. BEWARE IT MAY NOT BE THERE...

Keeping a small cachet of classic cars in a locked garage is not as safe as one thinks. The near 'terminal' 1950 Humber Tickford convertible has rested in its garage for the last 35 years and needs major restoration.

Over the years the Humber has gained a few stable mates, being a Jaguar Mk II with a hot Ford V8, the Jag being in good order but needing a rest. Joining the Jag soon after was the older Mk I Jag, with body and mechanicals fully restored and awaiting my retirement to finish it. To complement this trio was another Jaguar Mk II mint rolling body shell, also crammed into the garage.

Recently we decided to renovate the house and I left the cars in the padlocked metal garage. There was no one living in the house at the time. Everything was OK when I visited a couple of weeks ago, then a couple of days ago I discovered all the cars were gone. This must have been a mammoth undertaking to sort out the cars (flat tyres etc) and to load them would have taken a team of blokes a full day.

I have chassis numbers etc and if any fellow enthusiasts knows or hears anything please contact me or Knox Police (Senior Constable Church) as I believe the cars will be offered for sale or broken up into bits. A brief description is:

Humber 1950 Tickford convertible, needs major restoration, spare rolling chassis and body panels. Color is pale blue (this is 1 of 2 in Australia)

Jaguar Mk I sedan in grey primer, restored body shell with rebuilt 3.4L and 4spd, there is no interior or instruments or doors (these are safely somewhere else) the car has bolt on wire wheels

Jaguar Mk II sedan, old English white with a Ford 289 V8/auto trans. Car has excellent red vinyl interior and is lowered. Previous Victorian Reg 69-309

Jaguar Mk II sedan, charcoal metallic grey, rolling body shell (no interior, engine or transmission) with new suspension and wiring.

I have done lots of work on all of these cars (a few years ago, before kids) and decided to save them for my retirement, which is a couple of years away.

It would be unfortunate if a fellow enthusiast purchased one of these cars and spent considerable time and money then to find he did not have title to it. Naturally enough, when you do your own restoration/repairs you remember all the tiny details. Assuming the thieves know this (and they may not) the cars could be broken up for bits or just broken up.




