


The BBQ will be on if you wish to cook your chops, snags, steak etc. We can park some cars inside, others will need to park in the street.

#### Alternative:

Visit the excellent Sunday Market at Bittern Railway Station, on **Frankston-Flinders Road**, opposite the General Store.

On Frankston-Flinders Road, after leaving Hastings, travel to traffic lights/railway crossing and proceed straight on to Bittern. ### **An Amazing Story**

A mid-air collision on February 1, 1943, between a B-17 and a German fighter over the Tunis dock area, became the subject of one of the most famous photographs of World War II. An enemy fighter attacking a 97th Bomb Group formation went out of control, probably with a wounded pilot then continued its crashing descent into the rear of the fuselage of a Fortress named



All American, piloted by Lt. Kendrick R. Bragg, of the 414th Bomb Squadron. When it struck, the fighter broke apart, but left some pieces in the B-17. The left horizontal stabilizer of the Fortress and left elevator were completely torn away. The two right engines were out and one on the left had a serious oil pump leak. The vertical fin and the rudder had been damaged, the fuselage had been cut almost completely through, connected only at two small parts of the frame and the radios, electrical and oxygen systems were damaged. There was also a hole in the top that was over 16 feet long and 4 feet wide at its widest and the

split in the fuselage went all the way to the top gunners turret.

Although the tail actually bounced and swayed in the wind and twisted when the plane turned and all the control cables were severed, except one single elevator cable still worked, and the aircraft still flew - miraculously! The tail gunner was trapped because there was no floor connecting the tail to the rest of the plane. The waist and tail gunners used parts of the German fighter and their own parachute harnesses in an attempt to keep the tail from ripping off and the two sides of the fuselage from splitting apart. While the crew was trying to keep the bomber from coming apart, the pilot continued on his bomb run and released his bombs over the target.

When the bomb bay doors were opened, the wind turbulence was so great that it blew one of the waist gunners into the broken tail section. It took several minutes and four crew members to pass him ropes from parachutes and haul him back into the forward part of the plane. When they tried to do the same for the tail gunner, the tail began flapping so hard that it began to break off. The weight of the gunner was adding some stability to the tail section, so he went back to his position.

The turn back toward England had to be very slow to keep the tail from twisting off. They actually covered almost 70 miles to make the turn home. The bomber was so badly damaged that it was losing altitude and speed and was soon alone in the sky. For a brief time, two more Me-109 German fighters attacked the All American. Despite the extensive damage, all of the machine gunners were able to respond to these attacks and soon drove off the fighters. The two waist gunners stood up with their heads sticking out through the hole in the top of the fuselage to aim and fire their machine guns. The tail gunner had to shoot in short bursts because the recoil was actually causing the plane to turn.

Allied P-51 fighters intercepted the All American as it crossed over the Channel and took one of the pictures shown. They also radioed to the base describing that the empennage was waving like a fish tail and that the plane would not make it and to send out boats to rescue the crew when they bailed out. The fighters stayed with the Fortress taking hand signals from Lt. Bragg and relaying them to the base. Lt. Bragg signalled that 5 parachutes and the spare had been



"used" so five of the crew could not bail out. He made the decision that if they could not bail out safely, then he would stay with the plane and land it.

Two and a half hours after being hit, the aircraft made its final turn to line up with the runway while it was still over 40 miles away. It descended into an emergency landing and a normal roll-out on its landing gear.

When the ambulance pulled alongside, it was waved off because not a single member of the crew had been injured. No one could believe that the aircraft could still fly in such a condition. The Fortress sat placidly until the crew all exited through the door in the fuselage and the tail gunner had climbed down a ladder, at which time the entire rear section of the aircraft collapsed onto the ground. The rugged old bird had done its job.

Editors Note: Below is an abbreviated extract from Snopes.com.au

**ORIGINS:** The basic framework of this tale about a memorable act of gallantry of wartime is true: in December 1943, "Ye Olde Pub"- a B-17 commanded by 21 year old Lt. Charles L Brown- took heavy damage while on a mission to bomb a factory in Bremen, Germany. While attempting to head back to England with crippled plane and an injured crew, Lt. Brown encountered a German who, rather than shooting down the B-17, instead saluted his crew and disappeared. Nearly fifty years later Brown located and met up with that German pilot.

46 years later Brown located the German (Franz Stigler) and they now visit each other regularly.

"I didn't have the heart to finish off those brave men", Stigler later said. "I flew beside them for a long time. They were desperately trying to get home and I was going to let them do it. I could not have shot at them. It would have been the same as shooting a man in a parachute."



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



















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### Tri-Club run to Ferny Creek 27th. October 2013.

1980 to 1983. An impressive total of over 12 years on Committee. Long time members of the club will remember John as a friendly chap, who was the life of the party and very good at cracking jokes, especially at Committee meetings.

His first club car in 1968 was a 1938 Oldsmobile, which he told us he bought to pull his caravan. John and his family were probably the first family to take a caravan on an annual tour.

John's ever-changing collection of cars included Oldsmobiles from 19/35, 38, 39, 41. Chevs of 1937, 1940 and 1958, a 1936 Pontiac and a1930 Essex, but apparently his favourite was the 1938 Oldsmobile which he kept until around 2003.







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#### Federation of Veteran, Vintage and Classic vehicle Clubs

As the CHACA representative to the Federation I attended the General Meeting at Bright on the 19<sup>th</sup> Oct 2013. The following is a summary of that meeting.

- 1. The federation has concerns over the number of unregistered vehicles moving at rallies. The main offenders are tractors. It should be realised that **No** insurance, TAC cover or Public risk insurance applies to an unregistered vehicle moving under its own power.
- 2. The National Motoring Day will be celebrated on the 18<sup>th</sup> May 2014. Clubs need to organise events
- 3. Recently the Queensland government revised their "hoon laws". In future any modified vehicles that **do not** have engineering approval for the modifications, and are driven on Queensland roads and stopped by police, will result in the vehicle being confiscated and crushed. This legislation will also apply to interstate vehicles being driven on Queensland roads. Therefore if you are going to Queensland in a modified vehicle make sure you take along evidence of the engineering compliance.
- 4. Every two years the Federation runs a multiday Hub Tour for CPS vehicles. In 2014 this rally will be based at Frankston and they would like 60 cars to participate. The centre of operations will be Frankston RSL and the event will be over three days. Trips will be down around the Mornington Peninsula and the Dandenong's. Those interested please contact: Eric Belcher 97839770 or 0400933782 or <a href="mailto:eric.belcher@hotmail.com">eric.belcher@hotmail.com</a> to register your interest. The dates will be around mid April to Mid May. (To be finalised)
- 5. The usual Fed event at the Pakenham Race course will be moved for 2014 to the Scoresby Steam Park. The date for this event is 13<sup>th</sup> April 2014. This is the same weekend as previous but the race course is undergoing refurbishment and a temporary change of venue was required for next year.
- 6. Don't forget to put in your diaries the federation picnic at Maffra on 12th October 2014.
- 7. The Federation has been meeting with Vic Roads over various issues.

VSI8 will incorporate era-relevant mods etc.

It is possible that a RWC will be required for all post vintage cars. Club inspectors will only be able to inspect Veteran & Vintage (up to 31 Dec 1930).

VR are also looking at a new class of registration for modified vehicles. These vehicles will have their own number plate series.

In future owners applying for CPS registration through their club will have to enable the club officer to see the vehicle before paperwork will be completed.

For renewals VR will only accept signature of Secretary or permit officer of that club. Club is certifying that the vehicle is in compliance with regulations.

- 8. The federation in conjunction with VR is considering change of CPS vehicle eligibility to be 30 years or older in line with all other states.
  - Some of the Fed committee feel that 1985 should be cut off point and no ongoing year progression.

CHACA has advised the Federation that CHACA wants the 25year eligibility and no 1985 cut off time to apply i.e. to remain as it is at present.

**Technical Officer** – Annual report 2013 Technical Officer: Neville Thomas Kunnel reported as follows:

Good evening everyone.2013 continued to be a busy year for me mainly due to the changes brought about with the introduction of the Log Book scheme. As expected the Log Book scheme continues to bring in a lot of new registrations. There were 55 new registrations during the year, at present we have a total of 248 cars on club plates. A total of 9 cars were removed from the register since the owners chose not to renew their permits. 2 cars changed ownership during the year within the Club' The need for members to submit 3 photographs of their club Permitted cars continues to present challenges and we are addressing them on a case by case basis. 
