We're starting the tour at the Garage Classics museum, where we can enjoy Leigh's collection of cars, motorcycles and all varieties of automotive paraphernalia. Afterwards, after a good lunch in Mt Macedon, we'll take in some of the local attractions that suit your fancy before departing for home. Dicksonia Rare and Exotic Plant Nursery, just a short walk from the pub at 686 Mt. Macedon Rd. Owned and operated by Stephen Ryan who you may remember as host on ABC television's Gardening Australia which he did for 3 years.

Take a short drive further up the mountain and take in the great views of Melbourne and beyond from the Memorial Cross lookout

Visit local galleries or even a winery, or two!

Or Stay in the pub and settle in for the afternoon!

At your leisure, head on home and enjoy a safe drive home!

If the weather is fine, bring your club car and enjoy hassle free driving on quiet quality back roads across the open plains and then into the leafy Macedon area.






Even the building has an interesting history being a former customs building and tenanted by the government printer in the early 1900's.

Re: Club Permit Registration

Please be advised that VicRoads has been informed that a Defect Notice was issued to the above Club Permit.

Upon checking our records the club permit was issued on the 21st of October 2013. only a few weeks before the defect was issued on 24th November 2013 (copy

Please refer to the agreement signed by your club regarding vehicle safety:

The Club will not endorse an initial application for a club permit by one of its members unless it is satisfied that the vehicle included in the application is an eligible vehicle', is safe for use on a highway, and complies with any relevant safety standards notified to the Club by VicRoads. (In each case, the Club must either ensure compliance with the Club's statement of safety, or sight a current Certificate of Roadworthiness for the vehicle or, in the case of street rods, sight an authorised street rod inspection report.)

VicRoads can revoke approval to issue Club Permits if a Club is found to be in breach of the agreement. A record has been kept regarding the issue of this defect.

vicroad: This article was published in a recent Australian Street Rod federation magazine and is seriously significant for all Clubs that issue Club Permits. As can be seen in the article, there are significant consequences for noncompliance/abuse of this very generous scheme. Using the Club permit Scheme is something that has strict rules and they must be followed. Neither the user, nor especially the Club issuing the permit can afford to have members not abide by the rules so your cooperation is not only required, but indeed expected. Penalties apply all round otherwise.

> Of late, when a member receives a "Defect Notice" a copy is sent to Vicroads, who then send the Club a "Please Explain" letter (see copy attached). This is usually accompanied by a warning that the right to issue Club Permits may be revoked. Therefore the selfishness of some members will place at risk the rest who do the right thing.



DRAFT POLICY FOR DISCUSSION CHACA Club Permit Scheme Eligibility Criteria

CHACA is a VicRoads authorised Club to participate in the VicRoads Club Permit Scheme (CPS).

VicRoads has set rules to determine the eligibility of vehicles for the Club Permit Scheme. These may be viewed in the CPS handbook or on the VicRoads website.

CHACA has set its own additional requirements for vehicles to be submitted for the CPS using CHACA's authorisation. The addition requirements are in line with the original CHACA charter of vehicle originality and preservation.

The following are CHACA's requirements for Members submitting vehicles for CPS assessment.


- 1. The vehicle's age must be greater than 25 years from manufacture.
- 2. Vehicles submitted for CPS application must be as the manufacturer originally designed and built. Some modifications are permitted in line with the original manufacture option list, are period correct, or are based on safety issues, but in all cases must not detract from originality. Replicas derived from a lower model are acceptable as long as the appearance is as original as possible to the intended vehicle model (e.g. GT Falcon from a base Falcon).
- 3. Applicants for the CPS will certify that the vehicle submitted will remain roadworthy during the permit period and unmodified from what was originally submitted.
- 4. It will be the members' responsibility to maintain the vehicle in an unmodified and roadworthy condition for all permit renewal applications.
- 5. Determination of the eligibility for any vehicle submitted to CHACA for CPS will be at the discretion of the Committee.


